

# The Lord's Prayer

## (and The Book of Revelation)

### Father In Heaven... Hallowed be Thy name

In one translation it reads: 'May your name be held holy'...**In Rev. 5:** we see Him being held Holy numerous times, and picturesquely described, as well...in other parts of the Bible we generally see the command for him to be held so or a statement that He is held Holy by such...**In Rev.** we see all of the beings in the universe holding Him so, at the blessed event in which he is about to consummate the marriage of man and God...and end the long travail of tears...We see in Rev. the echo of the 5th commandment to honor they father and mother that thy days may be long...indeed these words are echoed in all the praise offered during the book of Rev. from the worshippers and the creatures, and the Holy things of the Heavenly Sanctuary...We see where God is in the center of them all, and more deliciously where the Lamb, His Son, is --in the center of the throne...**In Rev.** we see the father Jesus spoke so often about, and we see Man's Father: our Father...

### Thy Kingdom Come

**In Rev. 1:9** we get to see John as 'companion...in the Kingdom and patience of Jesus Christ'...**In Rev. 3:12** the promise of the name of the City of God to be written on those who overcome...**In Rev. 11:15** we get to see the kingdoms of this world becoming of the Kingdom of his Christ...**In Rev 12:10** we hear 'Now is come salvation and strength and the kingdom of our God and the power of his Christ'...**In Rev. 16:10** a kingdom full of darkness and in **Rev. 21:11** a kingdom (The New Jerusalem) full of light like unto a stone most precious (even like the description of the One who sat on the throne)...**In Rev. 20:9** we see the term 'the beloved city' being used...**In Rev. 21:2** we see the Holy City coming down from God out of Heaven already inhabited by the saints.

**In Rev.** we get to 'see' the King, His throne, His City, His presence, His family, His home, His servants, His name, and His people taking an active part in the heavenly services which prepare the kingdom... we see the advocate and the others who help him, --twenty four or so/more humans who attend with the prayers of saints.

**In Rev. 6:1** we get to see the effective steps of His words (the Gospel of this Kingdom) in the process of establishing this Kingdom...**In Rev. 20:9** we get to see the kingdom coming out from God out of Heaven and then breaking and consuming all other kingdoms with a fire which comes from heaven also. (Daniel 2:44 'it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms')... We get to see the last act of war for His people... **In the Rev. 19:11** we see the leader who comes out of Heaven to help lead the victorious last movement of his People...going forward conquering and to conquer. **In the Book of Revelation** we get to see everything concerning this kingdom finally done.

We should always do as The Master says and pray that His Kingdom come, or another way, we should always be acknowledging in prayer that His Kingdom is coming, that it is on the way, even here already.

## Thy Will Be Done

**Only in the Rev.** do we see His detailed edicts being done on a cosmic scale...Are the vials that are full of the wrath of God--do these *full things* represent the proclamations of God and are these the things he wants to happen? If yes, then these *full things* are the will of God being done.

In Gethsemane we saw His will being done, the lamb taking the sins of the world...In Heaven we see the Lamb with the Father, mingled in the midst of the light that surrounds the Father...The seals in the little book could only be loosed by the King or His prince...no other person but a person of equal value in will to the book could open them...**In the whole of Rev.** we see the will of God being expressed and the longing and expressions of those who have waited so long for this book to be opened and the end things come.

The book comes from the throne, the lightning comes from the throne, the voices come from the throne, the thunders that have meaning come from the throne. So when He says something --It is done. In the End Time details of the Book of Revelation it means that all of his words have born mature fruit and that sin has matured to its full fruit: His will has been accomplished. And that he who is righteous shall remain righteous, and etc.

**In the Rev. 4:10** we also see a marvelous display of humility on the part of the heavenly population who have been in his presence for ages... how they love Him, how they understand his will and his finale represented by the book in the hand of Jesus...**In the Rev. 5:9 and 11:15** they express loud and clear that he is finally going to do what he has promised to do...His will be done. **In the Rev. 11:17** we see in the explicit enunciation that the objective of his will is to set the universe right and to reign, and to joy over his subjects with singing and Rest...**In the Book of Rev.** we get to see numerous scenes of what it will look like when 'It is Done' ...from standing on sea of glass to singing before his throne with crowns harps and change of raiment...'Thy will be done.'

## Our Daily Bread

**In 2 Chronicles 14:11** Asa asked only for enough sustenance to avert the attack of Egypt. He asked only for the 'enough'; that God would do enough for that day.

Our manna in these last times shall be a sure word from God; along with all the other books, the book of Revelation is that manna.

Manna: sustenance, only what we need for the work at this time, daily bread.

**In the Book of Revelation** we see every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God having visible effect on the earth and on the heavens...The commandment, 'the words of life', are our 'meat day and night'...**In Rev. 12:17** it is the Dragon's desire to slay those who keep the commandments and have testimony of Jesus Christ: these words of life harm the dragon's reign.

**In Rev. 10:10** we see that prophecy is our daily bread; John took the opened book and ate it and experienced its message...sweet like manna of old...**In Rev. 10:2** we see the geographic area that prophecy will extend over in the future... This powerful Angel which comes down with the book that John wept over in the beginning of the book of Revelation, is still being enunciated from. There were seven seals, but there was also writing within and on the back side.

**In Rev. 5:4** we see John's distinct hunger for the words of life, this hidden manna, even after forty or fifty years of divine spirited service...still he hungered for *more* of God's will that was yet to be done...the hunger to see the Lord's future days and be satisfied.

The spiritual bread is His body. **In the Book of Revelation** we see His revelation to us about His nature, His life, His oil, His 'Not by might...but by my spirit' being opened up in a sealed Book.

### **Forgive Us Our Debts**

(Man trespassed on a tree that God had set apart. When they did that, they trespassed on His sovereignty by wanting to be or know as Gods...they wanted to own something that was not yet their right to own. Proverbs 25:6 "In the presence of the king do not give yourself airs, do not *take* a place among the great; better to be invited, 'Come up here', than to be humiliated in the presence of the prince." –New Jerusalem Translation. Adam and Eve trespassed beyond innocence before their time; they were destined by mystery hidden in God to be among the knowers of Good and Evil. (...little while lower than the angels..) **In the whole of Revelation** we see man being invited to sit on the throne, and more...)

**In Rev. 12:14,15** we see that when the flood out of the mouth of the Dragon trespasses on the woman's life God lifts up a standard of protection.

**In Rev. Chapt. 5, 7:14, and 7:17** we see the Lamb on the throne, the highest symbol of Forgiveness in the universe...The number without number are forgiven and thus are they before the throne with palms in their hands...They follow the Lamb whithersoever He goeth...

**In Rev. 5:9** we hear our elders say that they have been redeemed of debts, by Him.

### **Lead Us Not Into Temptation...Deliver Us From Evil**

**In Rev. chapt. 2 and 3** we see him leading them, nudging them with his spiritual words, knowing the nuances of their faults and tendencies like a shepherd know his sheep.

**In Rev. 6:1** we see Him leading them, *his horse*, conquering and conquering **In Rev. 14:1** we see them Delivered and restored, and are dressed white like sheep, gathered around the Lamb's throne...being taught a new song that none could learn but they. **In Rev. 14:4** we see that He has delivered and preserved them faultless before his Throne...they are without guile, virgins before Him (Eve was violated, scammed, deceived) **In Rev. 15:2** we see as He leads them to the sea of glass, then later to the tree of life in the paradise of God.

### **For Thine Is The Kingdom...**

One translation renders this 'Of Thee is the Kingdom'...indeed the literal translation of the word *thine* is 'of thee'. **In Rev. 21** we see the Holy City coming down out of Heaven: the presence of God...The Kingdom comes from Him.

**In Rev. 21:10** we see The Holy City being measured, described and setup on earth as His new capital.

**In Rev. 19:5** we see "...And a voice came out of the throne, saying, Praise our God, all ye his servants, and ye that fear him, both small and great. And I heard as it were the voice of a great multitude, and as the voice of many waters, and as the voice of mighty thunderings, saying, Alleluia: for the Lord God omnipotent reigneth." This edict is no small thing. The voice of the throne is saying this to 'all ye His servants, and ye that fear him, both small and great.' From the words used here, this multitude should be identified as every servant in the universe...every one in the Kingdom. And at this moment only the sentient of the universe are addressed this edict.

Several events attend this edict and one of them is the announcement of the marriage of the Lamb. This announcement of marriage follows the death judgment of the Babylon woman, and avenging of the blood of His servants at her hand.

In all, the Kingdom is set up and Revelation is the place we can view beforehand all its Heavenly details, and all the personalities which will play a part in the last scenes of Earth.
